

# LIVING WATER


## JOHN CHAPTER 4 VERSES 4 – 30

This month we are focussing on water, not just any water, but living water. Water is the one thing which all life needs in order to survive and thrive. Without it there will be no life.

In the passage from John we see Jesus on one of his many journeys. This day he is having to go through enemy territory as it were, not that the Jews were at war with the Samaritans, it's just that both sides did things differently.

To some this is such a familiar story, but to others it might not be so familiar. I am sure we have all been on journeys where we get thirsty and stop for a drink. This was Jesus' experience, left alone by a well while his companions went to buy food. Unfortunately he had nothing to draw water with from the well, but surprisingly, in the noon day heat, along

comes a woman to draw water. Now this was surprising as most women came in the cool of the morning. Jesus was intrigued to see her. He strikes up a conversation with her and asks if she will




draw some water for him, she was puzzled, because men did not usually converse with women in those days, and to top it all, he is also a Jew, talking to her, a Samaritan woman. As the conversation progresses he asks her to call her husband and he will talk to both of them about living water. Here the murky truth comes out, but Jesus

already knows and tells her about her life, that she has had five husbands and was now living with a man who was not her husband. All her life she had been trying to fill this empty space in her life with anything other than the true water of life which Jesus was now offering to her. Isn't this what we try to do? I know I have, until realisation dawns that we will never have our empty space filled by our own efforts. It is only Jesus who is the water of life who can fill that space, and will give us life in all its fulness.

This woman, who is an outcast in her own society, realises this man is someone very special, in fact Jesus reveals to her that he is the long-expected Messiah called the Christ. The woman even leaves her water jar behind in her eagerness to spread the news about this man. We are told the people came out of the town and made their way towards him. In verse 42 it says "We no longer believe just because of what you said, now we know that this man really is the Saviour of the World". Could we tell others that we have found the water of life in Jesus Christ?

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus give me your true and living water, that I might find my fulfilment in you. Amen

*We asked some of our VA team what their favourite association or place with water was. Here are their replies.*

## **The Font at Mottisfont Abbey**



One of my favourite 'watery' places is the Font at Mottisfont Abbey, which was founded as an Augustine Priory in 1201. At first glance it looks like a fairly ordinary pool of water set in a beautiful garden. But for me, ever since I first encountered it in the early 1980s, it has held a deeply spiritual significance. Mottisfont Abbey gets its name from the font and the fact that it was a meeting place where medieval villagers came to hold their moots or meetings. The source of the font is an underground spring.

It reminds me of the words Jesus spoke, referring to the Holy Spirit. "He who believes in me, as the scriptures said, 'From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water'". (John 7:38).

If you gaze directly into the font, there is no sign that the water is moving, it seems completely static. However, if you lift your eyes to the edge of the pool, you can see the water running off at quite a rate. In the course of the next few yards it tumbles over several small waterfalls and becomes a really lively stream. I have come to see that as a metaphor for those of us who believe that the Holy Spirit lives in us. To look at us, on the surface, you perhaps cannot see that anything is happening, but like the water silently pouring into the font, God continues to fill us with his Holy Spirit and like the font overflowing, so we overflow God's love into the world around us. It is by our response to the Holy Spirit that we can make use of this precious gift of the spring of living water that is bubbling up within us.

## Words and Water

"I'd like to be baptised in the River Jordan". There was a short silence at the end of the phone. "No, I don't think so" replied the church minister who was leading our forthcoming trip to Israel. My vision of stepping into the waters of the River Jordan was firmly rejected and, after his prayer for me, I put the phone down, with perhaps not the most generous of feelings towards him!

As it turned out, we had a wonderful trip to Israel and, would you believe it, the baptismal site was closed. Hmm...

I'd pondered about being baptised for quite a few years: Jesus clearly commanded it in His teaching and yet I was somehow reluctant to commit to this, with many reasons (excuses?) as to why it wasn't the right time for me. So, back from Israel, what now ...would I just carry on procrastinating?

Well, I couldn't think of anything better than being baptised in the River Jordan – but God could and, as I looked again at what the Bible said about being baptised, I had an overwhelming conviction - do it!

So what did that mean? It was not to be stepping quietly into the water of the River Jordan, but it was to be standing in front of a congregation of around 700 people and telling them how I became a Christian and what God was doing in my life, prior to entering the water of my church's small baptismal pool. God had waited until I was willing to do things His way!

Some years before I'd acknowledged to God that I'd shut Him out of my life, asked His forgiveness and for Him to give me a new way of living in relationship with Him. Through baptism I needed to demonstrate my Christian faith publicly.

So I spoke out and I stepped forward – into the water to identify with Christ's death, under the water to identify with His burial and out of the water to identify with His resurrection: symbolically my old life buried, sins washed away and a new life started. What a wonderful occasion it was.

Hurray! I'd done it – and not my way, but God's way. And the River Jordan? "No I don't think so" the minister had said. He was right and I was wrong ... but I got it right in the end!

We are fortunate here in the UK to have clean water when we turn on the tap. Many across the world do not. Here's some information from the charity Water Aid, helping to remind us to continue to be thankful and for those who can, to help others across our world to also have clean water available.

## Show Water Some Love

We all need clean water to stay safe and healthy. To wash our hands, to keep our homes and hospitals clean, and to protect ourselves against diseases and viruses.

Sometimes it's easy to take water for granted in the UK - with a twist of a tap it flows freely. But around the world 1 in 10 people don't have clean water at home. Instead they rely on rivers, ponds and hand-dug holes, which are often far away and polluted by waste. No one should have to sacrifice their health or safety just for this basic human right.

At a time when COVID-19 is still a very real risk, wherever you live, it's more important than ever that we work together to protect this vital resource. Handwashing with soap is the most effective way to stop the virus spreading. It's equally important in the UK too - so let's make sure everyone has access to clean water.

## **Why are people without access to clean water?**

There are a mixture of reasons:

- Poverty – limited money available
- Governments prioritising other areas
- Environment – such as drought and climate change
- Long distance from a water source
- Political instability, conflict and displacement

Governments may let water get left behind while focusing on other important priorities, like industry, roads, schools and hospitals. Many people live in countries where the national economy is too poor to create water infrastructure at the scale they need. Construction can also be difficult in many places because of extreme geography – like deserts, mountains and jungle – and not enough trained experts who know how to find long-term solutions.

Vulnerable people in society are affected most by this lack of clean water. Those living in hard-to-reach areas can be forgotten entirely, poor people can be priced out, and groups perceived as different can be denied access to them. Water Aid work with these communities to help them claim their rights to clean water.

## What does Water Aid do ?

**WaterAid is an international not-for-profit, determined to make clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene normal for everyone, everywhere within a generation.**

Since it started in 1981, they've remained resolutely focused on tackling these three essentials that transform people's lives. Without all three, people can't live dignified, healthy lives. With all three, they can unlock their potential, break free from poverty, and change their lives for good. Children grow up healthy and strong, women and men get to earn a living, whole communities start to thrive. It sounds normal and it should be.

### Story about Mulu

Mulu, 10, collects water from a nearby river in West Shoa, Ethiopia. Mulu told us:



*“Collecting water is the chore I hate the most. Yet, I have to do it at least three times a day – before school, right after school and just before it gets too dark. The river is down there, in the valley, which means I have to walk up the hill with the heavy jerry can on my back. As I leave the house to go to the river, I already think about how tired I am going to be by the time I get back home. It leaves me with a pain in my chest and my shoulder where the strap rests. But I know my family needs the water. We need at least 10 jerry cans between our animals and us. So I have to fetch at least some of it to help my mother.”*

Often, the only source of water for people living in the world's poorest communities is a pond or river. Imagine if your water was also being used by animals, as well as hundreds of other people for their daily activities, such as washing and bathing. Water like this can be full of the germs that spread diseases.

Have a read through the quiz included from Water Aid, you may be surprised at some of the answers.

- £12 can buy a handwashing bucket and stand in Southern Africa
- £120 can train 1 person to maintain a water pump in West Africa
- £2,200 can install a school water system in Asia

## **Ways We Can Save And Protect Water**

There are lots of ways we can all save some water, especially whilst we're spending more time at home:

- Keep your shower to four minutes long.
- Make sure your dishwasher is fully loaded before putting it on. And no need to rinse your dishes before loading them!
- Use a watering can instead of a hose or sprinkler to water your garden and plants.
- If you've been enjoying a paddling pool, use the water to refresh your flower beds and garden, rather than tip it away.

# The Boy Who Harnessed The Wind

In the UK, we can turn on a tap and water always comes out, day or night, summer and winter. It is clean and fresh.

The availability of water is essential to life and in Africa, it is essential for farming and growing food. Whole villages depend on dwindling water sources. The book with the above title is the true story from Malawi of William Kamkwamba who, in search of funds to continue his education and help his famine-stricken community, built a windmill out of scrap metal to bring light to his village.

The villagers were so poor they had to sell their land for development. The water sources for the village were lost due to these local industries. The clearing of woodland and increasing erosion of the soil, meant that when it did rain, the water just ran off the land too quickly to soak in to sustain a crop of sweetcorn. Also, there had been changes in the climate so that the rainy season had become more intense giving storms and flooding, and then a long dry season so hot and dry that any crops planted could not survive.

William's family were so poor he could not pay to go to school, but a kind teacher allowed him to use the school library and he found a book about making and using various energy sources. He learned about using batteries and found a scrap heap nearby where he could access old radios, car batteries and other metal items. The whole village was in crisis, and the young people left for work, and the school closed.

William had seen that the teacher's bicycle used pedal power to power the lights through a dynamo rubbing against a bicycle rim. He could see that a wind powered windmill could send power to the batteries and this could power a pump to pump water from the well to the irrigation channels. This, once set up, can happen every day.

*From dry soil to green shoots.....*



The solution came too late for some, but the village was saved and the villagers and in particular William's family could live off the land again.

William Kamkwamba himself returned to school, and is now attending the African Leadership Academy, a new pan-African prep school outside Johannesburg, South Africa.

An amazing story, all this came from a boy and his enthusiasm to create and channel power for good. Read the story or see the film.





## Make a Spiral Mobile that will move in the breeze

# TRADITIONAL LEMONADE

Make sure you chill the serving jug well beforehand and have plenty of lemon slices, mint leaves and crushed ice ready.



## Ingredients

- 4 unwaxed lemons
- 100g caster sugar

## Method

1. Using a vegetable peeler, thinly peel the zest from the lemons, leaving as much of the white pith behind as possible. Squeeze the juice from the lemons. Place the zest, lemon juice and sugar in a large heatproof jug.
2. Pour in 600ml boiling water and stir until the sugar has dissolved. Cover and leave to cool completely. Now, strain the lemon mixture into a serving jug and discard the zest. Dilute with 400ml chilled water and sweeten with extra sugar to taste.

Serve decorated with lemon slices, mint leaves and crushed ice. Enjoy!
