Easter, a day of light, brings hope for us all, as together across the world, in a multitude of languages we proclaim:

'Hallelujah! Jesus Christ is risen'

Heaven is for Real

'Heaven is For Real' is the title of a book and DVD, which tell the true story of a 4-year-old boy named Colton Burpo, who was undergoing emergency surgery for a burst appendix. His parents, realising their son might not make it, prayed with much anguish whilst he was in the theatre, and he made a miraculous recovery. However, they were totally amazed as over the months that followed, Colton started to tell them about his experience during that time.

The little boy recounted how he left his body during the operation and explained exactly where each of his parents were (in different parts of the hospital - praying). As the months went by Colton shared more snippets of what he had experienced and seen.

Although too young to have read the Bible, Colton described heaven in details totally in line with the Scriptures. He talked about meeting Jesus and sitting on his lap. He described what Jesus was wearing, and that He sat next to His Father. He mentioned just how big God is and how much He loves us and that he had spoken with angels.

One day Colton mentioned to his mother that he has two sisters, although he only had one. He insisted there were two and that one had died in Mummy's tummy. He had no idea that his Mum had suffered a miscarriage many years before he was born and yet the little girl ran up to him in heaven and gave him a hug.

Colton told his parents that in heaven no-one wears glasses and no-one is old. One day Colton said to his Dad that he had seen his Great-Grandpa in heaven, someone he had never met who had died when his Dad was very young. His Dad found a photo of his Grandpa and asked if this was the person, and yet Colton said no. However, when he showed a much younger photo of his Grandpa in his thirties, the little boy immediately recognised him as the person he had met in heaven. Colton's Great-Grandpa knew him too, even though Colton had been born decades after he had died!

Heaven is for Real is written by Colton's Father, Todd Burpo and published by Thomas Nelson. It is so encouraging, comforting and inspiring. It reminds us that eternity awaits us and that we need to be sure of our place in heaven. This is a fascinating book and DVD...but be sure to have a box of tissues handy! *Margaret*

Why Christians believe in the Resurrection

- We know from historical accounts that without doubt, Jesus really did die on the Cross. But we also have evidence from contemporary eyewitnesses that He appeared in a real, transformed body to many people after His death. So what happened in between?
- On Easter Day the tomb was found empty. Of course, an empty tomb is not proof of a resurrection. However, the site of Jesus' tomb was well known to Romans, Jews and the new Christians. A movement founded on the belief that




Jesus had risen, could never have started in the very city in which He had been publicly executed and buried, if the tomb was not empty.

- Indeed, no one disputed that the tomb was empty. The question was always, 'What has happened to the body?' In fact, it was the Jewish authorities who invented the story that the guards had fallen asleep whilst the body was stolen. They did so, because they knew that the tomb was empty.
- The account of the empty tomb is very early, from before AD 37. A legendary story could never have been concocted in such a short time, whilst eyewitnesses were still living.
- The accounts in the Gospels about the women finding the tomb empty are extremely straightforward and simple, in contrast to fictional accounts from 200 years later, which contain unrealistic details typical of legends.
- The unanimous account that the empty tomb was discovered by women argues for this to be true, as legends would have made men (considered more reliable witnesses at the time) the discoverers.

- Jesus' friends had no motive to steal His body, hide it and then proclaim He
 had risen, since they knew this would be a lie plunging them into very grave
 danger.
- The raising of Jesus from the dead by God was the central belief of the early Christians. They had to be quite sure it was true, since many went on to be martyred for refusing to deny the Resurrection.

If Jesus was not raised from the dead, Christianity falls apart. But Jesus meant it when he stated, 'I am the Resurrection and the Life.' (*John 11:25*) So believers in Jesus are promised that we can die in the confident expectation that we too will share in His eternal resurrection life.





The Timing of Easter

Ever since the Council of Nicaea, convened by Emperor Constantine in 325 AD, Easter Day has been fixed to the lunar cycle by falling on the Sunday following the first full moon of the vernal equinox (the time in spring when night and day are equal in length). This occurs between 22 March and 25 April, but is complicated by the Eastern Orthodox Julian calendar which is 13 days behind our Western Gregorian calendar. Easter is also deliberately linked to the Jewish festival of Passover.



This formula has been a matter of constant debate and dissent throughout the centuries and there have been at least 15 serious attempts to come to a decision. In 1925 the Easter Act proposed the Sunday after the 2nd Saturday of April, but there was no agreement. In 1997 the World Council of Churches meeting in Aleppo recommended a unified but not fixed date and the Archbishop of Canterbury suggested further talks. Subsequently, the Coptic Pope proposed the 2nd Sunday in April, apparently supported by Pope Francis, but the Bishop of Durham has pointed out the significance of the Passover imagery which should not be

lost. The Archbishop of Canterbury hoped for progress within 10 years! Judging by the continuing ecclesiastical dithering, agreement looks as far away as ever!!





Cut out a cross with one straight cut




Follow the steps over the page to show how you can cut out a shape of a cross from a regular piece of paper with one, straight cut!


1. Fold the top corner down to the edge of the paper.




2. Fold the top right corner down.




