

We also have lots of fun at our weekly Thursday Coffee, Cake & Connect drop-ins located at Lordshill Church.

The ongoing jigsaw and craft

sessions continue to go well with the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month being more dementia friendly with memory and singing sessions. One highlight of our year so far has been a prayer walk which 3 of us undertook (in the car - as the weather was too cold and icy to walk!), praying for all those



unknown to us who may be lonely, poorly or sad but known and loved by God.

If you would like to join our very special team to help with visiting, popping into the sheltered housing blocks to say hello to residents, offer befriending phone calls, support us in prayer, or help in any other way, we would love to hear from you.

Care Home links include monthly services at Speedwell Court. At Easter, Harvest and Christmas I join the Abbeyfield Chaplain in offering additional seasonal celebrations with stories, creative activities, prayer and song. I led the funerals of 2 residents, one of whom I also offered end of life bedside prayers. As well as Speedwell, I also go into other residential homes and sheltered housing to spend time with residents.



The chaplaincy flows alongside, and dove-tails with my lay ministry and role as Pastoral Coordinator. Supported by the pastoral team, a monthly Community Coffee Morning has been established. A wide range of older persons enjoy meeting and sharing together. Several who live with dementia come with their Carers.

Receiving referrals via Caraway, Admiral Nurses, Care Navigators and directly from relatives brings challenges yet these are outweighed by the privilege of 'being there', through home visits or phone calls, signposting to relevant resources for physical needs and supporting the spiritual well-being of lonely and isolated.

New Caraway Course for New Carers of People Living with Dementia

We have seen at our Memory Cafes how much a diagnosis of dementia in a family affects people. It is a new, unexpected and unwelcome journey that isn't going to go away. We have seen how carers struggle to get to grips with the new landscape and we are responding to help.

New dementia carers will be offered a course for carers that will describe the journey, help them to understand what is happening, what to expect and to realise how to live well with dementia. This course focuses on the emotional turmoil dementia can bring and provides tools and strategies for managing thoughts and feelings such as guilt, shame, pain, frustration and anger to mention a few.

The course includes the We Care - Dementia Care course led by Kellyn Lee, who will

Such a course would help carers to create support networks, know what help is available and how to access it, and how to look after their own health as well as the person who is living with dementia. So exciting.

We continue to distribute the monthly Vintage Adventure@Home packs free of charge to approximately 200 recipients, mainly across the City of Southampton but also to some readers further afield. The new format of providing it as an A5 booklet, rather than loose pages has proved popular. As usual, we focus on a theme for each edition, compiling a worship section, spiritual reflection, poetry, together with articles of more general interest as well as fun activities such as quizzes and word searches.

We welcome feedback and try to adjust what we offer to suit as many people as possible. Our themes for 2023 are based around the I AM sayings of Jesus. In addition, we are producing a special edition to celebrate the Coronation in May as we did for the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee last year.
