Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life." John 14 v.6

This is an extraordinary statement. We are used to living in a consumer society where we choose from a selection of goods on offer. Sometimes the choice can be so large as to be baffling. And yet we all do want to make the best choice from all that is available.

Jesus is not saying that He is a possible way, nor a possible truth, nor perhaps a good way of life.....He is THE real thing.

What does that mean for you today?

Here is a hymn by G.W. Doane expressing a response which you may echo.

Thou art the way, to Thee alone From sin and death we flee; And he who would the Father seek, Must seek Him, Lord, by Thee.

Thou art the truth, Thy word alone
True wisdom can impart;
Thou only canst inform the mind,
And purify the heart.

Thou art the life, the rending tomb Proclaims Thy conquering arm; And those who put their trust in Thee, Nor death nor he shall harm.

Thou art the way, the truth, the life:
Grant us that way to know,
That truth to keep, that life to win,
Whose joys eternal flow.

In the Old Testament we read how God led his people through the wilderness. By day the Lord went ahead of them in a pillar of cloud to guide them on their way and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night. Exodus 13 v.21

The psalmist was aware how difficult his path could be, but he trusted in God and wrote:

He will not let your foot slip, he who watches over you will not slumber. (Psalm 121 v3)

We all go through tough times. Perhaps your body sometimes lets you down, maybe you tumble, maybe you sometimes need a support to help you (a zimmer frame or a walking stick). The older we get the more we realise that we need help. God is there for us all the time, day and night, so that we can just keep going.

The Irish prayer known as St Patrick's breastplate includes these words:

Christ be with me,
Christ within me,
Christ behind me,
Christ before me,
Christ beside me,
Christ to win me,
Christ to comfort and restore me,
Christ beneath me,
Christ above me,
Christ in quiet,
Christ in danger,
Christ in hearts of all that love me,
Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.



In these days of false information I wonder if you sometimes wonder who you can trust. News on TV seems to be full of propaganda and broken promises.

Truth seems to be replaced with lies much of the time.

In the garden of Eden we read that the serpent started by casting doubt on what God had told Adam and Eve and then moving on to telling lies. (Genesis 3)

Jesus often emphasised that He was telling the truth, "*Truly I tell you*..."

Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life.

(John 5 v.24)

Take a moment to thank God for telling us the truth of His love for every one of us and especially for His love for you, yourself, made in His image, His precious child.

Reflection

I AM the Way

Can you follow a map? Sometimes when out walking in the countryside we have used an Ordnance Survey map, which shows us the footpaths we need to follow to get to our intended destination. More recently, owing to advances in technology, we can use Google Maps on our phones. If we are in our car, nowadays we have a Satnav, which provides a route for us.



The Holy Bible is rather like a map. If we are careful to follow the guidelines we find in it, it leads us to GOD our Heavenly Father. Jesus, Who Christians believe, is the Son of GOD, tells us that He is the **Way, the Truth, and the Life**. Through following him daily in faith, He promises to lead us to a better, richer, more abundant and meaningful life than we could ever achieve on our own.

In the early church, Christianity was sometimes called 'The Way,' and Christians 'Followers of the Way.'

Importantly, in John 14 verse 6 Jesus is emphasising that He alone is the way



to God, not one of many possible ways. He goes on, 'No one comes to the Father (GOD) except by Me.' He is the one and only access to God and salvation. Indeed, all the actions on which we pride ourselves, our

'good' works cannot save us. We must rely solely on what Jesus has done for us. This is non-negotiable. Of course, Jesus is pleased when we are kind and helpful, but we cannot earn our way into heaven. These good deeds are a sign of our love for Him but **not** the way of becoming reconciled to GOD. Jesus is the only way to eternal life in heaven after we die, and a fulfilling life here on earth.

In his poem *The Road Mistaken?* one of our Vintage Adventure community, David, admits that from time to time we may feel uncertain about the path we have chosen for our life's journey. However, Jesus assures us that, if we follow Him we won't get permanently lost, even though the road may have twists and turns. And even if we do make mistakes and go off the route God had in mind for us, we just have to tell Him we realize we've got things wrong and ask for His help. As the Creator and Sustainer of life, the wonderful thing is that Jesus can use our failures to get us back on track.



The disciples wanted to know exactly where this journey in faith would lead them. However, Jesus makes it clear that we won't know in advance every detail of the way we are supposed to travel in life. Instead, we are to simply trust in Jesus daily, walking in faith that HE is the way, and ask Him what our next step should be. Catherine Aldis reminds us in Threads of Gold that GOD actually DOES know best and that He has the pattern of our lives in His hands. How comforting!

After Robert Frost


So many paths diverged in the wood I was bemused; I couldn't guess how each would twist from where I stood or reach to where I thought I should be going. The choice seemed limitless.



Jesus said I am the The Way, the Truth, and the Life

"Lord," said Thomas, "we do not know where You are going, so how can we know the way?" Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me. If you had known Me, you would know My Father as well. From now on you do know Him and have seen Him." John 14 4-7

Many years ago, we went as a family on a day trip to Longleat. The stately home of the Marquess of Bath in Warminster, Wiltshire. When we arrived we wandered around the gardens and as it was late



morning thought we would just go quickly round the maze before stopping for lunch. Or so we thought! Off we went through the entrance to the maze, along this pathway then turning along another only to reach a dead end. We backtracked then tried taking another pathway and so on. This was so much harder than we had anticipated! We went round and round, up and down the pathways only to keep reaching dead ends. We could see where we needed to get to (a raised platform in the middle – with people proudly waving their arms and delighting in their success!) but it evaded us. Not ones to give in, we continued. We passed the same people coming in the opposite direction who were obviously as frustrated as we were and they almost became like long lost friends. Seeing them coming (again!) we would smile, wave and say hello!! The chocolate wrapper on the ground too became so familiar as we passed it again and again! How could this be so hard? In the end with the pangs of lunchtime hunger becoming more demanding and our daughters becoming more and more fed up with the whole situation we decided to call it a day and went back to the entrance.

It was there that I noticed something. There were 2 entrances to the maze side by side. One was wide and well trodden – the bushes had been kept trimmed back and it was a well used path. Next to it was a narrower pathway – a little overgrown, it didn't look as used. Leaving our disgruntled daughters safely behind – and not being ones to be beaten – off we went again. This time along

the narrow path and yes, you've guessed it – walked straight to the central platform where we could at last show off and let everyone know we had made it – at last!!

I have never forgotten that experience because it reminded me so much of the words of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel Chapter 7 v 13/14 "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it."

There are times when we just don't know what road to take in life or which way to turn but we can be sure that if we follow Jesus we will be safe. There are many demands on our attention in these days, lots of false claims and it is so easy to be sucked in and journey on the wrong road. So many religions offer a new way to find peace but Jesus said "I Am the Way, the Truth and the Life, no one comes to the Father except through Me". A few years ago a phrase was coined WWJD -what would Jesus do? So when you are not sure what to do, think – what would Jesus do – then follow Him and you won't go wrong. God bless you - Margaret

Facts about the Maze at Longleat



Built in 1978, Longleat's hedge maze is the largest in the UK and was once the largest maze in the world, built from over 16,000 English yew trees. The maze was the idea of Alexander Thynn, 7th Marquess of Bath, who lived in Longleat House

until his death in 2020. An observation tower marks the maze's centre point and the aim is to arrive at the tower, which is easier said than done thanks to numerous dead ends built into the yew paths. There are also six bridges, which offer great views of the grounds and also a vantage point for trying to plot your way around (or out of) the maze. Longleat House is an Elizabethan-era building, the current structure of which dates back to the 16th century, being officially completed in 1580. https://www.historyhit.com/locations/longleat-maze/



Large print Psalms, Proverbs & New Testaments which are generally free. Margaret (Anna Chaplain) has links.




If you prefer a magazine style format why not try.....

Called **Bible Reflections for Older People** they are lightweight to handle and in larger font, providing a set of single page reflections (a couple of verses, short thought for the day and prayer).


